Fundraising appeal

January is always a time of reflection as we start to prepare our annual report and accounts for the previous year. Once the figures have been audited, we expect our income to be around 24% less than the previous year.

It cost around £72,000 to keep the charity running last year, but our income was around £17,000 less than that. For six out of the last eight years, we have raised less funds than we need, and this is not sustainable.

Competition for grant funding is more fierce than ever, because so many charities have struggled to survive during the Covid pandemic. In 2021, we applied for over £75,000 worth of grant funding, but only 22% of it was awarded. The previous year, we applied for a similar amount, and were awarded 50%, which shows what a difference a year makes. Some funds have reported being over-subscribed by over 1,000% in 2021.

Unlike other charities, we have never charged a membership fee and we remain committed to being accessible to everyone, never excluding anyone from any of our services on grounds of ability to pay.

We have been serving people living with sight loss in our community for over 150 years, and we want to make sure we are here in the decades to come so we can help more people just like you.

If every person who receives this newsletter donated just £2 a month (£24 a year), our funding deficit would be wiped out.

With £24, we can:

- Staff our telephone helpline for two hours
- Pay for a DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check for a volunteer (full cost including VAT is £19.20)
- Buy refreshments for one of our coffee mornings
- Pay our office rent for a day and a half
- Pay towards the petrol required for our Sight Loss Advisor to get to home visits

We do not receive any funding from central Government, or from other sight loss charities. We are very grateful for the kind support of Wakefield Council,

with whom we have a grant funding agreement which helps towards the costs of our home visiting service and the delivery of our Living Well with Sight Loss courses. We rely on fundraising to cover the rest of our costs.
