Jason and the Wakefield Adventure – Audio Described Tours available!
The brand-new blockbuster exhibition by Wakefield-born disabled artist
Jason Wilsher-Mills runs from Friday 20th June until Sunday 7th

Forgotten Women of Wakefield – Beyond Braille Creative Workshops
Tuesday 22nd July, 1pm-3pm and 4pm-6pm at CoffeeWrite, 4 Marygate,

Wakefield, WF1 1NX.

Join the Forgotten Women of Wakefield team at one of two workshops to hear about the history of the Wakefield Blind Society, which later became Wakefield District Sight Aid.

Formed in 1869 two influential women, Emily Fennell and Edith Wright, went on to change the course of history locally, regionally, nationally, and internationally with their campaign to make ophthalmia neonatorum a notifiable disease and

led the way in establishing nationwide 'Workshops for the Blind'.

You will learn about the challenges the women faced, the people who supported them (and those who didn't) and will be able to respond to what you are learning with paper weaving, badge making and painting on old records, anything you feel you want to capture from their story whilst sharing yours.

CoffeeWrite has two entrances, one on Marygate and one on Silver Street. Our workshops will take place on the upper level, accessed by Silver Street making them accessible to all. There is no cost to these workshops, but we ask that you buy a coffee from CoffeeWrite to support this small independent business.
